ON THE PAPERS DECISION

- [1] This application relates to the hosting of an event on Saturday 12 August 2017.
- [2] The event is a 30th Birthday Celebration and it is expected to be attended by approximately 50 people.
- [3] Food will be available for at this event.
- [4] A Manager has been appointed to supervise the sale and supply of alcohol. Security has been hired for the event.
- [5] The Inspector has reported favourably in regard to the application.
- [6] No matters have been raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 141(1), accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.
- [7] I am satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in s.142 of the Act and I grant the applicant a special licence pursuant to s.104 (1).
- [8] The licence will not issue until all relevant clearances have been obtained. The applicant is not entitled to sell alcohol until the licence issues. Unlicensed sales can result in imprisonment for up to three months or a fine of \$40,000 (sec 233 (a) and (b) of the Act).
- [9] The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence to not comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act, specifically sections 46 to 63.

[10]The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on a licence.

[11]The licence will be subject to the following conditions:-

Compulsory conditions- section 147(3)

(a) Alcohol will only be sold on the following day and times.

Saturday 12th of August 2017 from 7.30pm to 1.00am the following day.

(b) Drinking water will be freely available to customers on the premises as specified in the application.

Discretionary conditions – section 147(1)

(a) The licence holder must display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.

(b) Food must be available for consumption on the premises as specified in the application.

(c) Low-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises as specified in the application.

(d) Non-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises as specified in the application.

(e) The licensee must provide assistance with or information about alternative forms of transport from the premises as specified in the application.

(f) Entry is restricted to invited guests only.

(g) A copy of this licence together with signs showing the age restrictions must be clearly displayed.

MINUTE

- [1] This minute relates to an application by **Grouse Entertainment Limited** for the renewal of the On-Licence in respect of premises situated at **50 Ferrymead Drive, Christchurch**, known as **‘Murder Mystery Dinner Theatre’**. The licence expired, if not renewed, on 3 July 2017.
- [2] The applicant seeks a waiver to allow the late filing of the application for renewal.
- [3] The facts of the matter were conveyed to the committee by the Alcohol Licensing Inspector.
- [4] The applicant was sent the renewal forms before the expiry of the licence. A follow up email was sent to the applicant by a member of the Alcohol Licensing Team on 3 July 2017. The applicant made the renewal payment on 3 July but the actual renewal application form was only submitted on 25 July 2017 after further reminders from the Alcohol Licensing Team.
- [5] There is no question that the applicant is a good operator and well regarded by the regulatory agencies.
- [6] The question that must first be asked is whether it is within the power of the committee to grant a waiver for the late filing of a renewal application.

- [8] Section 122(2) of the Act is quite clear and is confirmed by section 127(2).
- [9] 122(2) If no application to renew a licence has been made before the end of its currency, it expires at the end of its currency.
- [10] 127(2)(b) must be made no later than 20 working days before the expiry of the licence, or by such date **(not being later than the date of expiry of the licence)** as the licensing committee may allow; and **(my emphasis)**
- [11] The applicant now seeks a waiver under section 208 of the Act to allow consideration of the renewal application by the DLC. s. 208 of the Act states.
- [12] *208. Where any person has neglected or omitted to do any act or thing in a precise manner or precise time prescribed by this Act, the licensing Authority or (as the case may require) the licensing committee or the chairperson, if satisfied that the neglect or omission was not wilful, may waive the same on such terms as they think equitable.*
- [13] Any decision of the committee must first be legal and then reasonable. For the committee to wholly rely on reasonableness as a foundation for a decision would be denying the intent of the statute and would be 'ultra vires'.
- [14] The facts in this case are that a renewal application has not been lodged within the statutory timeframes stipulated in sections 127(2)(b), although a payment was made before the expiry. The paying of the fee is not the same as lodging the application and the Act is clear that the application must be lodged.
- [15] The authority in the matter of the ability of the Authority to grant a waiver in relation to a renewal lodged after the expiry of the licence is the High Court decision of *AZ Hobson Liquor Limited* CIV-2012-404-0052-40; [2012] NZHC 2331. In the oral decision of Venning J he was dealing with the late filing of a renewal for a licence.
- [16] The application was being made under the previous legislation but the provisions of the Acts are virtually the same.
- [17] The conclusion that Venning J came to was that there was no jurisdiction to grant a waiver.
- [18] At para [25] and [26] Venning J outlines his reasoning.

[25] The difficulty for the applicant, however, is that the additional wording in the brackets in s41(2)(b) effectively applies a cut-off date beyond which an application for renewal cannot be accepted and the waiver provisions of s 111 cannot be applied. It cannot be said that the application for renewal has been duly made if it is made after the expiry of the licence because at that stage the licence in issue has expired. There is nothing to be renewed. It would seem the only option at that stage would be for an application for a fresh licence. The consequences of that I accept appear harsh but that is the effect of the section as I read it.

[26] While it may appear harsh, it must be noted that the application must be made within 20 working days of the expiry of the licence. There is effectively a period of grace of some 20 working days during which s111 would have effect and could apply to extend the time for a late application. However, once the licence has expired then, given the express wording of s41(2)(b) I am not able to accept the interpretation argued for that the Court could apply s111 to further extend the time beyond that.

[19] The precedent is clear and the committee, though wanting to be reasonable and also being aware of the consequences for the applicant and their staff, must first act legally and to grant the waiver, as stated previously would in my opinion be *ultra vires*.

[20] For the reasons stated above the request to grant a waiver is declined.

[21] The Committee would recommend that the applicant in this matter speak to the Alcohol Licensing Inspector regarding the process from this point on. This situation is not unique and there are a number of avenues which could be explored which would allow the applicant to honour commitments which are already booked.

- [1] This is an application by Friday Beers Limited for an Off Licence in respect to premises situated at 23 Warrington Street, Christchurch and trading as "Friday Beers".
- [2] The premises are a residential home and have not previously been licensed.
- [3] The applicant seeks to operate an Off Licence with sales being made through the internet and therefore seeks an endorsement under Section 40 of the Act.
- [4] The premises will operate as an on line site and the sales will be dispatched from other suppliers.
- [5] The applicants have considerable experience in the industry.
- [6] The Inspector reported no issues with the premises, and has outlined in the report the requirements of the Act in relation to the application of section 59 and applicable regulations under the Act.
- [7] The Police and Medical Officer of Health have no objection to the granting of this licence.
- [8] The Medical Officer of Health did raise the issue that the name "Friday Beers" and any promotions could raise an issue of encouraging people drink to an excess at their place of work. That was an issue in the late 1990s but the practice of after works drinks has diminished considerably since then. They were assured that such wording on the applicant's website would not encourage such actions. They did not oppose the application.

- [9] There is no question as to the suitability of the applicant nor regarding any other criteria with which I must have regard to in those sections.





ON THE PAPERS DECISION

- [1] This is an application by Camp David Limited for an Off Licence in respect to premises situated at 141 Marine Drive Diamond Harbour CHRISTCHURCH and trading as "On the Spot Diamond Harbour".
- [2] The premises have not previously been licensed. These premises are currently operating as a Grocery store and seek to include alcohol as part of the service to their customers.
- [3] The store operates predominantly as a supermarket, it has a floor area less than 1000m² and so is considered to be a grocery store.
- [4] This is a small store and the alcohol sales are only displayed for sale in a single and separate area of the store. We are satisfied that the location of this area and. fridge is not adjacent to the sales area and is not part of a direct route through the store.
- [5] The store is some distance from Christchurch and any other Off Licence.
- [6] The Inspector reported no issues with the design and layout of the premises, and has outlined in the report his understanding of the requirements of the Act in relation to the application of sections 112 to 115.
- [7] The Police and Medical Officer of Health have no objection to the granting of this licence.

- [8] Under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 the application for a new licence must be measured against a broader set of formulae than was the case under the previous Sale of Liquor Act 1989. Section 116 of the Act sets out the relevant criteria to which we must have regard.
- [9] When seeking an off licence of the kind applied for here, for a grocery store, section 132(1)(b) applies. This states that 'the licensing authority or the licensing committee concerned **MUST** (my emphasis) impose any conditions subject to which it must issue a licence of that kind'. This in effect brings the application under sections 112, 113, 114 and 115 of the Act. These sections detail the compulsory conditions relating to display, promotion and advertising of alcohol in a single area in supermarkets and grocery stores.
- [10] At section 112(1) the purpose of these conditions is set out, *Compulsory conditions relating to display and promotion of alcohol in single area in supermarkets and grocery stores:*
- The purpose of this section and sections 113 and 114 is to limit (so far as is reasonably practicable) the exposure of shoppers in supermarkets and grocery stores to displays and promotions of alcohol, and advertisements for alcohol.*
- This section places the renewal application, and the conditions which must be applied to it, in context.
- [11] There is no question as to the suitability of the applicant nor any other of the criteria with which I must have regard to in those sections.
- [12] Any area designated as a single area must promote both the object of the Act and the purpose, or intention, of the condition as set out at section 112(1).
- [13] The area as described by the applicant in their plan fits all the criteria. It is not in the area between the entrance and the main body of the premise and it is not in the area between the main body of the premises and the general point of sale.
- [14] I am are satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in sections 112, 113, 114, 115, 116, 117, 105 and 106 of the Act and the licence is granted for a **period of 1 year** pursuant to s.130.:
- [15] The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence not to comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act, specifically sections 46 to 63 and 231(1).
- [16] The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on the licence.
- [17] The licence will be subject to the following conditions:-

Compulsory Conditions – section 116(2)

The following conditions are compulsory:

- (a) No Alcohol may be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1pm on ANZAC Day.
- (b) Alcohol may only be sold or delivered on the following days and during the following hours
Monday to Sunday 8am to 9pm.
- (c) Water must be freely available to customers, while alcohol is being supplied free as a sample on the premises.
- (d) **SINGLE AREA Conditions : alcohol Area for display and promotion of Alcohol**
 - Only the area described and delineated on the plan approved by the District Licensing Committee is the permitted area for the display and promotion of alcohol within the premises as required under section 112.
- (e) No alcohol may be sold other than—
 - (i) beer that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for beer; or
 - (ii) mead that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for mead; or
 - (iii) fruit or vegetable wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for fruit or vegetable wine; or
 - (iv) grape wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for grape wine; or
 - or
 - (v) a food flavouring, prepared for culinary purposes, that is unsuitable for drinking undiluted.
- (f) Signage must be displayed stating (directly or by description) a place or places on the premises at which drinking water is freely available to customers, while alcohol is being supplied free as a sample on the premises.

Discretionary Conditions – section 116(1)

ON THE PAPERS DECISION

The Application

- [2] These premises have been previously licensed. It has been trading under the provisions of a Licence with the Off-Licence number **060/OFF/55/2014**
- [3] The general nature of the premises is that of a Wholesale Distribution Centre.
- [4] The application was duly advertised and no public objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received.
- [5] No matters have been raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 103(1) and accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers.
- [6] The hours sought are from 7am till 11pm the same day. These hours are within the default national maximum trading hours for an Off-Licence of 7am to 11pm the following day.
- [7] The applicant has experience in the industry.

Inspector's Report.

- [8] The Inspector reported no issues with the premises, and has outlined in the report the requirements of the Act in relation to sales under the Act.

Police and Medical Officer of Health.

[9] The Police and Medical Officer of Health have no objection to the granting of this licence.

Decision

[10] The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence not to comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act, specifically sections 46 to 63 and 231(1).

[11] We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.105 and 106 of the Act and we grant the licence for a period of **3 years** pursuant to s.130.

[12] The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on the licence.

Conditions

[13] The licence will be subject to the following conditions and all other conditions as identified on the licence.

Discretionary conditions – section 110 (1)

The following conditions are discretionary:

- (a) the following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - Display of appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons
- (b) the following steps must be taken by the licensee to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the management of the premises concerned are observed :
 - Alcohol must only be sold, supplied and consumed within the area marked on the plan submitted with the application.

Compulsory conditions – Section 116 (2)

The following conditions are compulsory:

(a) No alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1pm on Anzac Day.

(b) Alcohol may only be sold or delivered on the following days and during the following hours:

Monday to Sunday 7.00am to 11.00pm:

(c) Water must be freely available to customers, while alcohol is being supplied free as a sample on the premises.

Other Discretionary conditions – Section 117

- (a) the following steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
- The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in their host responsibility policy aimed at promoting the reasonable consumption of alcohol.

Conditions applying to all remote sales for the sale and supply of alcohol:

- (a) The following information must be displayed on the internet site in a prominent place, in any catalogue used by the licence holder and on every receipt issued for any alcohol sold via the internet site:
- (b) The licence holders name, the licence number, and the date on which the licence expires.
- (c) A copy of the licence or a clearly identified link to such an image must be displayed in a prominent place on the internet site.
- (d) The following steps must be taken to verify that people are over the purchase age:
- 1) In the case of an order made using an internet site, telephone order, or physical order – the prospective buyer must declare that he or she is 18 years of age or over (and where the prospective receiver is involved that the prospective receiver is also 18 years of age or over) –
 - (i) Once when the prospective buyer first commences the order process; and
 - (ii) Again, immediately before the sale of alcohol is completed.

Other restrictions and requirements to be noted on the licence

I recommend the following restrictions and requirements are noted on the licence:

Section 56 – Display of signs

Section 57 – Display of licences

Section 59 - Requirements relating to remote sales by holders of off-licences

Section 214 – Manager to be on duty at all times and responsible for compliance

- [8] The applicant's attention is drawn to section 136(5) of The Act where it states that they carry "the same duties, obligations, and liabilities as the holder of the on-licence or off-licence concerned".
- [9] The granting of Temporary Authorities is based on the premise that they are 'Temporary' and are a vehicle to allow the applicant time to apply for a permanent licence. The applicant should be aware that it is the opinion of this Committee that a substantive licence application should be submitted to the Committee within six weeks. If there are legitimate reasons for a delay then the time may be extended but the question of suitability could be raised if an application is not submitted in a timely fashion.

(b) Drinking water must be freely available on the premises as specified in the application.

Discretionary Conditions – s147(1)

The following discretionary conditions apply-


- (a) The licence holder must display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory requirements on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.
- (b) Food must be available for consumption on the premises as specified in the application.
- (c) Low alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises as specified in the application.
- (d) Non alcoholic beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises as specified in the application.
- (e) The licensee must provide assistance with or information about alternative forms of transport from the premises as specified in the application.
- (f) A copy of this licence together with signs showing the age restriction must be clearly displayed.
- (g) Entry is restricted to staff only.
- (h) Alcohol may only be sold, supplied and consumed in the area marked on the plan submitted with the application.

The licence is also subject to the following conditions which in the Committee's opinion are not inconsistent with the Act

- (a) Noise should be controlled so as not to disturb neighbouring residents.

The premises are designated supervised.

- Alcohol must only be sold, supplied and consumed within the area marked on the plan submitted with the application.
- (c) Conditions prescribing the people or kinds of person to whom alcohol may be sold or supplied.

Compulsory conditions – section 110 (2)

The following conditions are compulsory:

DECISION ON THE PAPERS

The Application

- [1] This is an application by Vignesh Enterprises Limited for a renewal of an On-Licence in respect to the premises situated at 217 Marine Parade CHRISTCHURCH, trading as 'South of India'.
- [2] The general nature of the premise is that of a Restaurant. It is located among a small group of shops in the new Brighton Mall.
- [3] No issues have been raised in opposition by the agencies as required by section 129. Accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers.
- [4] The Alcohol Licensing Inspector has reported on the application and states that the premise is intended as a Restaurant and its principal purpose is the consumption of food. These premises have been previously licensed. It has been trading under the provisions of an On-Licence number **060/ON/137/2014**.
- [5] The hours sought are from 8am till 1am the following day. These hours are within the default national maximum trading hours for an On-Licence of 8am to 4am the following day.
- [6] The applicant has provided a limited list of substantive food options and the low alcohol and non-alcohol refreshments that will be available at all times the premises is open for the sale and supply of alcohol.

[7] The application was duly advertised and no public objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received.

Inspector's Report

[8] The Inspector reported no issues with the premises, and has outlined in the report the requirements of the Act in relation to sales under the Act.

Police and Medical Officer of Health

[9] The Police and Medical Officer of Health have no objection to the granting of this licence.

Decision

[10] I am satisfied as to the matters which we must have regard to as set out in s.105 and 106 of the Act and we grant the licence for a period **of 3 years**, pursuant to s.130.

[11] The systems and policies in place are applicable for licences of this kind.

[12] The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence to fail to comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act; specifically sections 46 to 63 and 231(1).

[13] The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on the licence.

Conditions
