DECISION 'ON THE PAPERS'

- [1] This application relates to the seeking of a special licence for the holder of a club licence to hold a 'Pool Evening' for NZ Express Transport on the premises. The event is scheduled to take place on Saturday 6 May 2017.
- [2] The premise has run numerous functions both under specials, and for its own club member's, without any reported issues.
- [3] There are expected to be approximately 40 guests attending the event.
- [4] A qualified manager will oversee the service of alcohol.
- [5] No matters have been raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 141(1), accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.
- [6] I am satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in s.142 of the Act and I grant the applicant a special licence pursuant to s.104(1).
- [7] The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence to not comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act, specifically sections 46 to 63.
- [8] The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on a licence.
- [9] The licence will be subject to the following conditions:-

Compulsory conditions- section 147(3)

(a) Alcohol will only be sold on the following day and times.

Saturday 6 May 2017 from 5.00pm to 12 midnight.

(b) Signage must be displayed stating (directly or by description) a place or places on the premises at which drinking water is freely available to customers while the event described is taking place.

Discretionary conditions – section 147(1)

- (a) The licence holder must display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.
- (b) Food must be available for consumption on the premises as specified in the application.
- (c) Low-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises as specified in the application.
- (d) Non-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises as specified in the application.
- (e) The licensee must provide assistance with or information about alternative forms of transport from the premises as specified in the application.
- (f) Entry is restricted to invited guests only.
- (g) A copy of the licence, together with signs showing the age restriction, must be clearly displayed.
- (h) Alcohol must only be sold, supplied and consumed within the area marked on the plan submitted with the application.

The licence is also subject to the following conditions, which in the committee's opinion are not inconsistent with the Act:

Noise should be controlled so as not to disturb neighbouring residents.

[1] This is an application by **Addington Raceway Limited** for a renewal of an On-Licence, with change in respect of premises situated at, **75 Jack Hinton Drive, Christchurch**, known as **Addington Events Centre**.

[2] The general nature of the premise is that of an events centre and bar/bistro.

[3] The application was received by the Christchurch District Licensing Agency on 17 March 2017, the criteria under s.131 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 will apply. The change to the licence concerns licensed area and the applicant wishes to reduce this so that it removes part of the carpark area from the licence. This is reflected in the new plan supplied with the application.

[4] I am satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in s.131 of the Act and pursuant to s.211(1)(c) the Committee's attitude to this application is that it should be granted, I hereby grant the applicant an On-licence pursuant to s.104(1).

[5] The Committee notes that the licence shall be for 364 days a year and that on the remaining day, namely the New Zealand Trotting Cup Day a Special Licence will need to be applied for.

[6] No matters have been raised in opposition in any reports as required by s.103, accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.

[7] No issues have been raised by the agencies in regards to s 105 of the Act.

[8] The application was duly advertised and no public objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received.

[9] I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.105 and 106 of the Act and we grant the licence for a period of 3 years pursuant to s.104.

[10] The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence not to comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act, specifically s.46 to 63 and 231 (1).

[11] A **waiver** is sought and granted pursuant to s.208 of the Act in respect to the public notices which did not notify the changes to the licenced area by the removal of part of the parking area. I do not believe this has disadvantaged any party as this was a reduction in area not an increase.
