- [1] This is an application by HALSWELL UNITED ASSOCIATION FOOTBALL CLUB **INCORPORATED** ('the applicant") for renewal of a Club Licence pursuant to s.127 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 ("the Act") 2012 in respect of premises situated at 301 Halswell Road, Christchurch, known as 'Halswell United Association Football Club'. The premises operate under an existing licence, which expires on 9 August 2024.1
- [2] The general nature of the premises is that of a Sports Club.
- [3] The application was received by Christchurch District Licensing on 24 July 2024. The application was publicly notified and remained on the website in compliance with statutory regulations. No objections were received.
- [4] There is no objection from the NZ Police and from the Medical Officer for Health.
- [5] The Inspector's Report sets out the background to the application and addresses matters to which regard is to be had in sections 105 and 106 and 131 of the Act.² The Inspector has also addressed the matters in s.60 and s.62 regarding authorised

customers and no bring-your-own alcohol. The Inspector notes that the applicant has requested a condition under s.60(1)(b) allowing alcohol to be sold and supplied to a person who is on the premises at the invitation of an authorised visitor who is also on the premises. The Inspector recommends the grant of the licence for three years subject to conditions.

- [6] On the basis that there are no outstanding matters raised in opposition in any reports as required under s. 103 of the Act I can deal with the application on the papers.³
- [7] I am satisfied after standing back and evaluating all the matters placed before me and having had regard to the criteria as set out in s.105 (and informed by s.106) and s.131 of the Act and that granting the application subject to conditions achieves the purpose and objects of the Act.
- [8] Accordingly, pursuant to s.130(1) of the Act I grant the application for a renewal of a Club Licence for a period of three years subject to the following conditions:

The Licensed Premises

(a) The premises are identified on the plan provided with the application for a licence being the first floor club rooms only.

Designation - section 119

(b) The licensed area is undesignated.

Discretionary conditions – section 110 (1)

- (c) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - (i) Display of appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.
- (d) The principal entrance for the purposes of display of signage and a copy of the licence is the main entrance to the club rooms.
- (e) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the management of the premises concerned are observed:

(i) Alcohol must only be sold, supplied and consumed within the area marked on the plan submitted with the application.

Sale and Supply in Clubs to Members and Guests – section 60

- (f) The holder of a Club Licence must ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied to any person for consumption on the premises unless the person is an authorised customer, being:
 - (i) Any member of the Club; or
 - (ii) Any person who is a guest on the premises at the invitation of, and is accompanied by, a member of the Club; or
 - (iii) Any member of another Club with which the Club has an arrangement for reciprocal visiting rights for members (authorised visitors).
- (g) A member, in relation to a Club, means a person who:
 - (i) Has expressly agreed in writing to comply with the Club's rules; and
 - (ii) Is recognised as a member of the Club by those rules.
- (h) Alcohol may be sold and supplied to a person who is on the premises at the invitation of an authorised visitor who is also on the premises pursuant to s.60(1)(b) of the Act,
- (i) Alcohol may only be sold or supplied on the following days and during the following hours when the premises are being operated as a Club:
 - (i) Monday to Sunday, between the hours of 12:00 midday and 11:00pm
- (j) Water will be freely available to customers on the premises while the premises are open for business.

Section 117 - Other Discretionary conditions

(k) The following steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:

(i) The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in its Host Responsibility Policy⁴ aimed at promoting the reasonable consumption of alcohol.

Other restrictions and requirements

- (I) Section 51 Non-alcoholic drinks to be available
- (m) Section 52 Low alcoholic drinks to be available
- (n) Section 53 Food to be available
- (o) Section 54 Help with information about transport to be available
- (p) Section 56 Display of signs
- (q) Section 57 Display of licences
- (r) Section 60 Sale and supply in Clubs to members and guests only.
- (s) Section 61 Administrative requirements for Club Licences.
- (t) Section 62 No bring your own alcohol in Clubs
- (u) Section 214 Manager to be on duty at all times and responsible for compliance
- [10] The licence shall be renewed for three years.
- [11] The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence not to comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under the Act, specifically s.46 to s.63 and 231(1). The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on the licence.

- [6] On the basis that there are no outstanding matters raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 141(1) of the Act I can deal with the application on the papers.³
- [7] I am satisfied after standing back and evaluating all the matters placed before me and having had regard to the criteria as set out in section 142 of the Act that the granting the application subject to conditions achieves the purpose and objects of the Act.
- [8] Accordingly, pursuant to section 104(1) of the Act I grant the application for a Special Licence for the event subject to the following conditions:

The Licensed Premises

- (g) Food must be available for consumption on the premises as specified in the application.
- (h) Low-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises as specified in the application.
- (i) Non-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises as specified in the application.
- (j) The licensee must provide assistance with or information about alternative forms of transport from the premises as specified in the application.
- (k) A copy of the licence as well as age restriction signage must be clearly displayed.
- (I) Entry is restricted to the Tier ticketing system used by the Club with appropriate wrist banding viz General Admission (public), Member areas and Corporate.

- (n) The Alcohol Management Plan provided with the application is to be read as a condition of the licence and must be adhered to.
- (o) This licence does not excuse the applicant from obtaining where necessary a Building Consent in respect of tents or marquees.

of the event at the following GA Bars, noting that the 2-drink maximum does

not affect the "Welcome Orders" in the Show Gate Reserved Carparks:

(q) There is a maximum serves per person of 4 low alcohol beers for the

duration of the event at the following GA Bars (Low Alcohol beer is defined

The Tea House Lawn GA Bar

The licence is also subject to the following conditions, which in the

- [4] The NZ Police and the Medical Officer of Health are not opposed to the application.

Also permitted are samples to be provided free of charge on the premises.
- [7] The stall holders are as follows: Off-licenses Auld Distillery Limited trading as Auld Farm Distillery; Colony Aoteroa Limited trading as Colony; Herrick Creek Limited trading as Herrick Creek Distillery; Longshot Distillery trading as The Classy Tart Enterprises; Arwin Limited trading as Sovrano Limoncello; and Two Rivers Marlborough trading as Two Rivers.
- [8] The overarching on-licence is for the following: Baa Baa Bar; Members Marquee; and Sheep Breeders Site.
- [9] On the basis that there are no outstanding matters raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 141(1) of the Act I can deal with the application on the papers.²
- [10] I am satisfied after standing back and evaluating all the matters placed before me and having had regard to the criteria as set out in section 142 of the Act that the granting the application subject to conditions achieves the purpose and objects of the Act.
- [11] Accordingly, pursuant to section 104 (1) of the Act I grant the application for a Special Licence for the event subject to the following conditions:

A copy of the licence must also be either legibly displayed or a link provided to it.

- (e) No alcohol is to be sold or supplied on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1:00pm on ANZAC Day.
- (f) Alcohol may only be sold on the following days and during the following hours:
 - (i) Any time on any day
- (g) Section 59(1) Delivery to the buyer is not permitted at any time after 11:00pm on any day and before 7:00am on the next day.

Section 117 - Other Discretionary conditions

b) again, immediately before the sale of alcohol is completed

(ii) The person who takes delivery of the alcohol is over the age of 18 years and

is not intoxicated.

(k) Section 212 – Appointment of Manager to be on duty at all times and responsible

for compliance



DECISION ON APPLICATION FOR A 10TH TEMPORARY AUTHORITY (ON THE PAPERS)

- [1] This is an application for a 10th Temporary Authority made by **RJ BROTHERS LIMITED** ('the applicant') under section 136 of The Act in respect of premises situated at **3/1 Musgrove Close, Christchurch**, known as **'Big Barrel Wigram'** and trading under On-Licence number 60/OFF/60/2022. The licence expires on 16 June 2025.
- [1] The application was received on 19 November 2024.
- [2] The applicant fulfils the criteria for the granting of an authority as set out in the Act, they have tenure and there is a valid licence for the existing premise.
- [3] There is no opposition from the Licensing Inspector, nor the Police to the granting the Temporary Authority.
- [4] We are satisfied as to the matters we must have regard to as set out in section 136 of The Act.

[5] The applicant's attention is drawn to section 136(5) of The Act where it states that they carry "the same duties, obligations, and liabilities as the holder of the on-licence or off-licence concerned".

[6] The duration of the Temporary Authority shall be no more than 3 months from the date

of the decision or when a substantive licence is issued, whichever occurs first.

[7] A substantive licence application has been lodged and a new Off-Licence application was heard, with the DLC decision being appealed to ARLA. The applicant is awaiting direction from ARLA in this matter.

DECISION ON APPLICATION FOR SPECIAL LICENCE (ON THE PAPERS)

- [1] This is an application by **ANTHONY DESMOND CARRINGTON** ('the applicant') for a Special Licence under sections 22 and 138 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 ('the Act') in respect of premises situated at **2A LEWIS STREET, CHRISTCHURCH.**
- [2] The general nature of the event is referred to as: 'New Years Eve Party'. The number of people attending is said to be approximately 100.
- [3] The applicant has appointed Anthony Carrington as the duty manager (60/CERT/675/2018).
- [4] The NZ Police and the Medical Officer of Health are not opposed to the application.

[5] The Inspector's Report sets out the background to the application and addresses the matters to which regard is to be had in section 142 of the Act. The Inspector recommends the grant of the special licence for the event subject to conditions.

[6] On the basis that there are no outstanding matters raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 141(1) of the Act I can deal with the application on the papers.²

[7] I am satisfied after standing back and evaluating all the matters placed before me and having had regard to the criteria as set out in section 142 of the Act that the granting the application subject to conditions achieves the purpose and objects of the Act.

[8] Accordingly, pursuant to section 104 (1) of the Act I grant the application for a Special Licence for the event subject to the following conditions:

The Licensed Premises

This special licence authorises the sale, supply, and consumption of alcohol within the premises identified on the plan provided with the application and attached to and forming part of this licence.

Compulsory conditions – section 147(3)

(a) Alcohol may only be sold under the licence only on the following days and during the following hours:

31st December 2024 11:00pm to 01:00am on 1st January 2025.

(b) Drinking water will be freely available on the premises as specified in the application.

Discretionary conditions – section 147(1):

(a) The licence holder must display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of

alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.

- (b) The licensee must provide assistance with or information about alternative forms of transport from the premises as specified in the application.
- (c) Food must be available for consumption on the premises as specified in the application.
- (d) Low-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises as specified in the application.
- (e) Non-alcoholic beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises as specified in the application.
- (f) A copy of this licence, together with signs showing the age restriction must be clearly displayed.
- (g) Alcohol must only be sold, supplied and consumed within the area marked on the plan submitted with the application.
- (h) Entry is restricted to persons aged 18 and over.

Section 147 (2) - Restricted and supervised areas: Nil

The licence is also subject to the following conditions, which in the committee's opinion are not inconsistent with the Act:

- a. Noise should be controlled so as not to disturb neighbouring residents.
- [9] The applicant's attention is drawn to section 259 of the Act which makes it an offence to not comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under the Act.
