With Washington Way as a prime example, all new skateparks include skate bowls, which the vast majority of users are not able to use to their full potential. Instead, it would be a good idea to have a simple flat area with a few obstacles (ie a ledge, a rail and a manual pad) which would be much more accommodating to those of all skill levels. This would also provide a large level of savings which could be used elsewhere, either in creating extra obstacles or providing extra amenities in the skatepark, such as a few bins and a water fountain.</p> <p>In terms of the design, I believe that the money that has gone in extra design for the aesthetics of the skateparks is money that would be better spent elsewhere - once more, to go towards extra obstacles that are more accessible to all users.
