DECISION ON THE PAPERS

This is an application by **W J Turner Limited** for the renewal of an Off-Licence in respect of premises situated at **19-23 Fendalton Road, Christchurch** known as ‘**Fendalton New World**’.

The premises trades as a supermarket.

The application was duly advertised and no public objection or notice of desire to be heard was been received.

No matters have been raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 129 accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers.

The Alcohol Licensing Inspector recommends renewal with the appropriate conditions attached to the licence.

The applicant has sought a variation to the trading hours of so that they may open 30 minutes earlier. This will allow the opening hours and the sale of alcohol hours to align. The variation is granted. The new trading hours shall be Monday to Sunday 7.00am to 11.00pm.

There is no question as to the suitability of the applicant nor any other of the criteria with which I must have regard to in sections 105 and 106 of the Act.

When seeking to renew an off licence of the kind applied for here section 132(1)(b) applies. This states that 'the licensing authority or the licensing committee concerned must impose any conditions subject to which it must issue a licence of that kind'.

This in effect brings the application under sections 112, 113 and 114 of the Act.

These sections detail the compulsory conditions relating to display, promotion and advertising of alcohol in a single area in supermarkets and grocery stores.

Any area designated as a single area must promote both the object of the Act and the purpose, or intention, of the condition as set out at section 112(1).

The area as described by the applicant in their plan fits all the criteria. It is not in the area between the entrance and the main body of the premise and it is not in the area between the main body of the premises and the general point of sale.

I am satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in sections 112, 113, 114, 115, 116, 117, 105 and 106 of the Act and the licence renewal is granted for a period of 3 years pursuant to s.130, with the following conditions:

The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on the licence.

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:-

Compulsory Conditions – section 116(2)

The following conditions are compulsory:

(a) No Liquor may be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1pm on ANZAC Day.

(b) No alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Easter Sunday unless the alcohol is grape wine or fruit or vegetable wine made on the premises.

(c) Liquor may only be sold or delivered on the following days and during the following hours

Monday to Sunday 7am to 11pm.

(d) No alcohol may be sold other than—

(i) beer that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for beer; or

(ii) mead that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for mead; or

(iii) fruit or vegetable wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for fruit or vegetable wine; or

The current license number is **060/OFF/76/2007**.

The application was duly advertised and no public objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received.

No matters have been raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 129 accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers.

Though the Police have not opposed the licence they reported that;

'A site visit was conducted on 22 November 2014 and while Police were there the duty manager was observed serving an intoxicated customer.

The duty manager did not agree with the intoxication assessment by Police however a 280 and 285 application will be submitted to ARLA in due course.

Despite this, there are no other suitability issues and Police have had no previous issues with the suitability of the applicant.

As the reporting date has now passed Police do not oppose this application but wish to bring this to the attention of the committee."

The matter was heard 'on the papers' by the Authority on the 17th of March 2015. The applicant did not dispute the grounds for the application and a 24 hour suspension of the licence was imposed along with a negative holding.

The Alcohol Licensing Inspector states that *"The recent sale of alcohol to an intoxicated patron is a serious offence and questioned the applicant's suitability, however I consider this incident contrary to normal practice and a one off event. In my experience Imperial Discount Liquor Limited have effective systems, staff and training to comply with the law."*

The Inspector recommends a three year renewal. As none of the agencies have sought a reduction in the renewal period, or opposed the renewal of the licence, the committee will trust their judgement and hopes that the applicant has learnt from the incident.

I am are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.105 and 106 of the Act and the licence renewal is granted for a period of 3 years pursuant to s.130.

The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence to not comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act. Specifically sections 46 to 63 and 231(1).

DECISION ON THE PAPERS

Introduction

- [1] This is an application by **Purcell Supermarkets Limited** for the renewal of an Off-Licence in respect of premises situated at **300 Stanmore Road, Christchurch** known as **New World**.
- [2] The premises trades as a grocery store and fits the requirements of section 32(1)(e). It could be described as a 'supermarket'.
- [3] The current license number is **060/OFF/15/2013**.
- [4] The application was duly advertised and there was a public objection received. This objection was based on the 'single area' where alcohol was presented for sale. This objection was later withdrawn.

- [5] The application has taken sometime to determine due to the differing opinions regarding the interpretation of the Single Area Condition (SAC) as outlined in section 112 to 115 of the Act.
- [6] There were a number of DLC decisions being made regarding the Single Area Condition and these were appealed to the Authority for determination.
- [7] The only criteria which this application was being delayed on was the SAC and it seemed prudent to await the decision of the Authority before making a determination of it.
- [8] These appeals have been heard and guidance has been given regarding the interpretation of the SAC. With this guidance in mind this application can now be determined.

Inspector's Report.

- [9] According to the Alcohol Licensing Inspector's report the premises has traded for many years in its current location. The owners have provided accounts which show that they are eligible to hold an off licence under the new Act and can be designated a 'Supermarket'.
- [10] The applicant has not come to the attention of the agencies and is considered suitable to hold a licence.
- [11] The premise is located within a business/residential area of the suburb of Richmond, Christchurch.
- [12] The Inspector reported no issues with the design and layout of the premises, and she outlined in her report her understanding of the requirements of the Act in relation to the application of sections 112 to 115.

Police and Medical Officer of Health.

- [13] The Police and Medical Officer of Health objected to the layout of the single area. This was later withdrawn by both agencies.

The legislation

- [14] Under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 the application for renewal of a licence must be measured against a broader set of formulae as was the case under the previous, Sale of Liquor Act 1989.

- [15] Section 131(1) of the Act sets out the relevant criteria to which we must have regard and specifically points to section 105(1) subsections (a) to (g), (j), and (k).
- [16] When seeking to renew an off licence of the kind applied for here, a supermarket, section 132(1)(b) applies. This states that 'the licensing authority or the licensing committee concerned **MUST** (my emphasis) impose any conditions subject to which it must issue a licence of that kind'; ...
- [17] This in effect brings the application under sections 112, 113, 114 and 115 of the Act.
- [18] These sections detail the compulsory conditions relating to display, promotion and advertising of alcohol in a single area in supermarkets and grocery stores.
- [19] At section 112(1) the purpose of these conditions is set out,

112 Compulsory conditions relating to display and promotion of alcohol in single area in supermarkets and grocery stores

(1) The purpose of this section and sections 113 and 114 is to limit (so far as is reasonably practical) the exposure of shoppers in supermarkets and grocery stores to displays and promotions of alcohol, and advertisements for alcohol.

- [20] This section places the renewal application, and the conditions which must be applied to it, in context.

Decision and reasons

- [21] As mentioned in the introduction the criteria when considering a renewal is set out in sections 132 and 105 of the Act.
- [22] There is no question as to the suitability of the applicant nor any other of the criteria with which I must have regard to in those sections.
- [23] Any area designated as a single area must promote both the object of the Act and the purpose, or intention, of the condition as set out at section 112(1).
- [24] The area as described by the applicant in their plan fits all the criteria. It is not in the area between the entrance and the main body of the premise and it is not in the area between the main body of the premises and the general point of sale.

Conclusion

- [25] I am are satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in sections 112, 113, 114, 115, 116, 117, 105 and 106 of the Act and the licence renewal is granted for a period of 3 years pursuant to s.130, with the following conditions:

- (1) The single area shall be the north east corner of the premises as defined in the plan which accompanied the licence application.

[26] The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence not to comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act, specifically sections 46 to 63 and 231(1).

The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on the licence.

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:-

Compulsory Conditions – section 116(2)

The following conditions are compulsory:

- (a) No Alcohol may be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1pm on ANZAC Day.
- (b) No alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Easter Sunday unless the alcohol is grape wine or fruit or vegetable wine made on the premises.
- (c) Alcohol may only be sold or delivered on the following days and during the following hours

Monday to Sunday 7am to 11pm.

- (d) No alcohol may be sold other than—
- (i) beer that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for beer; or
 - (ii) mead that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for mead; or
 - (iii) fruit or vegetable wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for fruit or vegetable wine; or
 - (iv) grape wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for grape wine; or
 - (v) a food flavouring, prepared for culinary purposes, that is unsuitable for drinking undiluted.
- (e) Only a single area as delineated on the attached plan is a permitted area for the display and promotion of alcohol.
- (f) Signage must be displayed stating (directly or by description) a place or places on the premises at which drinking water is freely available to customers, while alcohol is being supplied free as a sample on the premises.

- a) The licence holder must display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.
- b) Food must be available for consumption on the premises as specified in the application.
- c) Low-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises as specified in the application.
- d) Non-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises as specified in the application.
- e) The licensee must provide assistance with or information about alternative forms of transport from the premises as specified in the application.
- f) Members of the public must be excluded from the premises in the following circumstances: Entry is restricted to ticket holders only.
- g) Alcohol may be sold in the following types of container only: plastic cups
- h) The licence is also subject to the following conditions, which in the committee's opinion are not inconsistent with the Act:
 - Noise should be controlled so as not to disturb neighbouring residents.
 - Alcohol must only be sold, supplied and consumed within the premises as per the details in the application provided.
 - A copy of the licence, together with signs showing the age restriction must be clearly displayed on the premises.
 - The entire premises is designated as a SUPERVISED area.

DECISION ON THE PAPERS

Introduction

- [1] This is an application by General Distributors Limited for the renewal of an Off-Licence in respect of premises situated at 347 Moorehouse Ave, Christchurch known as Countdown, Moorehouse .
- [2] The premises trades as a 'supermarket'.
- [3] The current license number is **060/OFF/11/2012**.
- [4] The application was duly advertised and there was no public objection received.

Inspector's Report.

- [5] According to the Alcohol Licensing Inspector's report the premises have traded for many years in its current location..

- [6] The applicant has not come to the attention of the agencies and is considered suitable to hold a licence.
- [7] The premises are located within a business area of the central city.
- [8] The Inspector reported no issues with the design and layout of the premises, and she outlined in her report her understanding of the requirements of the Act in relation to the application of sections 112 to 115.

Police and Medical Officer of Health.

- [9] The Police and Medical Officer of Health have no objection to the granting of this licence.

The legislation

- [10] Under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 the application for renewal of a licence must be measured against a broader set of formulae as was the case under the previous, Sale of Liquor Act 1989.
- [11] Section 131(1) of the Act sets out the relevant criteria to which we must have regard and specifically points to section 105(1) subsections (a) to (g), (j), and (k).
- [12] When seeking to renew an off licence of the kind applied for here, a supermarket, section 132(1)(b) applies. This states that 'the licensing authority or the licensing committee concerned **MUST** (my emphasis) impose any conditions subject to which it must issue a licence of that kind'; ...
- [13] This in effect brings the application under sections 112, 113, 114 and 115 of the Act.
- [14] These sections detail the compulsory conditions relating to display, promotion and advertising of alcohol in a single area in supermarkets and grocery stores.
- [15] At section 112(1) the purpose of these conditions is set out,

112 Compulsory conditions relating to display and promotion of alcohol in single area in supermarkets and grocery stores

(1) The purpose of this section and sections 113 and 114 is to limit (so far as is reasonably practical) the exposure of shoppers in supermarkets and grocery stores to displays and promotions of alcohol, and advertisements for alcohol.

- [16] This section places the renewal application, and the conditions which must be applied to it, in context.

Decision and reasons

- [17] As mentioned in the introduction the criteria when considering a renewal is set out in sections 132 and 105 of the Act.
- [18] There is no question as to the suitability of the applicant nor any other of the criteria with which I must have regard to in those sections.
- [19] Any area designated as a single area must promote both the object of the Act and the purpose, or intention, of the condition as set out at section 112(1).
- [20] The area as described by the applicant in their plan fits all the criteria. It is not in the area between the entrance and the main body of the premise and it is not in the area between the main body of the premises and the general point of sale.

Conclusion

- [21] I am are satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in sections 112, 113, 114, 115, 116, 117, 105 and 106 of the Act and the licence renewal is granted for a period of 3 years pursuant to s.130, with the following conditions:
- (1) The single area shall be as defined in the plan which accompanied the licence application.
- [22] The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence not to comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act, specifically sections 46 to 63 and 231(1).

The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on the licence.

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:-

Compulsory Conditions – section 116(2)

- (a) No Alcohol may be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1pm on ANZAC Day.

The hours sought are from 8am till 11pm. This is consistent with other premises which operate as a Café.
