Food will be served by way of a continuous supper.

A waiver of the requirement to have a qualified manager to oversee the sale and supply of alcohol is sought. This is granted.

The Inspector has reported favourably in regard to the application.

No matters have been raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 141(1), accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.

I am satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in s.142 of the Act and I grant the applicant a special licence pursuant to s.104 (1).

The licence will not issue until all relevant clearances have been obtained. The applicant is not entitled to sell liquor until the licence issues. Unlicensed sales can result in imprisonment for up to three months or a fine of \$40,000 (sec 233 (a) and (b) of the Act).

The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on a licence.

Wednesday of each week from July 2014 to July 2015 from 5.00pm to 10.00pm the same day.

Signage must be displayed stating (directly or by description) a place or places on the premises at which drinking water is freely available to customers while the event described is taking place.

The directors of the company are experienced at running licensed premises, as they have operated a similar premise in the city previous to the earthquakes, as well as 'Smash Palace' on the corner of Bealey Avenue and Victoria Streets post-earthquakes.

Jonathan Moore is the principal of the company and will be 'hands on' in the management of the premises.

According to the Alcohol Licensing Inspector's report there were concerns raised about issues occurring in the surrounding area. The site is currently quite isolated as most of the surrounding buildings have been demolished. To address this a security firm will be employed, initially to work with all the bars in the area to provide roving patrols.

Police opposed the application on first reporting, as the building was not completed and they were unable to fully report on the design and layout. A subsequent report has been received and their opposition has been withdrawn.

No matters have been raised in opposition to the application in any reports as required by section 103, accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers.

The application was duly advertised and no public objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received.

The hours in the application state Monday to Sunday 8.00am to 3.00am the following day, but the hours in the public notice state Monday to Sunday 8.00am to 1.00am the following day.

As this is a material inconsistency there is not the power to grant a waiver under section 208 of the Act, if one was sought, which it has not.

The licence can issue until the closing time of 1.00am and it will be for the applicant, if it so wishes, to seek a variation of hours to 3.00am and re-advertise the public notice with the extended hours.

I am satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in s.105 and 106 of the Act and the licence is granted for a period of 1 year pursuant to s.104.

The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence to not comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act. Specifically sections 46 to 63 and 231(1).

The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on a licence.

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:-
