 - A copy of the licence, together with signs showing the age restriction must be clearly displayed on the premises.

Section 57 – Display of licences

Section 214 – Manager to be on duty at all times and responsible for compliance

The consumption of alcohol will usually be confined to the foyer area and function rooms but consumption of alcohol may also extend to include the whole theatre or identified parts such as the stage for a particular function.

A comprehensive Host Responsibility Policy and menu was supplied after the application was submitted. These have alleviated some fears regarding the standard of the food offering as well as the 'BYO' aspect of the original food and beverage guide.

No matters have been raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 103 accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers.

No issues have been raised by the agencies in regards to sections 105 of the Act.

The application was duly advertised and no public objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received.

The Police report states that the applicant was told not to sell alcohol until a new licence was issued but was found a day later selling alcohol. The licensee was charged with allowing the sale of alcohol on unlicensed premises and pleaded guilty.

No explanation for the actions of the Licensee accompanied the application.

The new Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 at section 202(1) gives the District Licensing Committee the authority if there are no objections to either grant the application on the papers or convene a public hearing to consider the application.

It is the decision of this committee to convene a public hearing to consider this application as there are matters regarding the suitability of the applicant to be determined.

The Police are asked to supply to the committee a copy of the Summary of facts for the charge as well as the sentencing notes of the Judge.

DECISION ON THE PAPERS

This is an application by the **Vbase Limited** for a new On-Licence in respect of premises situated at **445 Hagley Avenue, Christchurch**, known as the **'Hagley Pavilion'**. It was received by the licensing committee on 25 August 2014.

The premises are a new building and therefore have not previously been licensed.

The general nature of the premise is that of a Sports Pavilion and Function Venue.

The applicant is a company which is wholly owned by the Christchurch City Council and has 4 directors. Three of the directors are current serving Christchurch City councillors.

Vbase runs a number of venues in Christchurch including the main rugby stadium and Horncastle arena.

The application for a resource consent was decided in the Environment Court, decision number [2013] NZEnvC281, and has a number of limiting conditions included in it. These include the days of the week when some activities can take place as well as conditions limiting the hours of operation.

In regards to the conditions attached to the resource consent the applicant must realise that any breaches of the consent conditions may affect their suitability in relation to the liquor licence.

The hours applied for in this application are those of the resource consent but the consent requires that the premises be cleared by these times, not just the sale of alcohol ceased. Management will need to be mindful of this.

It is interesting to note that the maximum occupancy for the premises has been set at 794 persons but that the resource consent sets a limit of 300 persons at any one function.

The pavilion is not open to the general public during match days and alcohol will only be sold and supplied to members and players. At other times alcohol will be sold during booked functions.

This licence only applies to the pavilion building and any activities outside of this where alcohol will be sold or supplied will be licensed by way of a special licence.

No matters have been raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 103 accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers.

No issues have been raised by the agencies in regards to sections 105 of the Act.

A Pavilion management plan is a condition of the resource consent and it particularly relates to noise and its management as well as patron control.

A menu and host responsibility plan were submitted by the applicant and the agencies have no concerns relating to these.

In the report by the Alcohol Licensing Inspector she states that “there have been minor compliance matters at other venues where licences, including special licences, are held by the applicant but that the agencies are working through their concerns with the applicant”.

The inspector also included in her report that “discussions have been had with the applicant about providing information to the inspector with regard to when functions are to be held. This is to enable the agencies to effectively monitor the premises”.

It has been agreed that the applicant will provide the inspector with the following information on a monthly basis

- Date of Function
- Time
- Reason for function
- Number of people attending

This will be read as an undertaking by the applicant.

The application was duly advertised and no public objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received.

No designation was sought regarding the premises and this is appropriate.

I am are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.105 and 106 of the Act and we grant the licence for a period of 1 year pursuant to s.104.

The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence to not comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act. Specifically sections 46 to 63 and 231(1).

The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on a licence.

The licence shall not issue until all building and compliance matters are signed off.

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:-

Compulsory conditions – section 110 (2)

The following conditions are compulsory:

- (a) **No Alcohol is to be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1pm on ANZAC Day to any person who is not present on the premises to dine.**
- (b) **Alcohol may only be sold or supplied on following days and during the following hours when the premises are being operated as a Sports Pavilion or Function Venue:**
 - **Sunday to Thursday 9.00am to 10.00pm**
 - **Friday and Saturday 9.00am to 12 midnight.**
- (c) **Water will be freely available to customers on the premises while the premises are open for business.**

- (a) **the following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:**

- (b) **the following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the management of the premises concerned are observed:**
