The Inspector has reported favourably in regard to the application.

No matters have been raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 141(1), accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.

I am satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in s.142 of the Act and I grant the applicant a special licence pursuant to s.104 (1).

The licence will not issue until all relevant clearances have been obtained. The applicant is not entitled to sell liquor until the licence issues. Unlicensed sales can result in imprisonment for up to three months or a fine of \$40,000 (sec 233 (a) and (b) of the Act).

The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence to not comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act. Specifically sections 46 to 63.

The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on a licence.



DECISION ON THE PAPERS:

- [1] This is an application by Croftwood 2012 Limited for the variation of their off-licence. The premises trades as a Supermarket. The application arises due to the construction of a new building on the site adjacent to the existing supermarket. The premise is known as ‘Ferry Road New World’.
- [2] The applicant intends to continue to trade on the existing site until the new premise is completed. Both premises will close until the new operation is changed over to the new premise. The variation is to increase the size of the current licence to include the new premise.
- [3] Both the directors of the company and the ‘owner/operators’ have a long history within the grocery industry.
- [4] The current licence expires on the 10th of July 2017. The licensed hours are Monday to Sunday 7.00am to 9.00pm. These are to remain the same.
- [5] The application was duly advertised and no public objection or notice of desire to be heard was been received.
- [6] No matters were raised in opposition in any reports as required by section 103, accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.
- [7] The Alcohol Licensing Inspector recommends the grant of the licence with the appropriate conditions attached.

- [8] There were issues raised by the Committee regarding the original plan for the 'Single Alcohol Area' in the light of the High Court decision of *Christchurch Medical Officer of Health v J & G Vaudrey Limited*¹. (This decision is now under appeal to the Court of Appeal).
- [9] The applicant was asked to reassess the 'Single Alcohol Area' in the light of the High Court *Vaudrey* decision. A new single area plan was subsequently submitted by the applicant.
- [10] The agencies were given the opportunity to comment on the new plan The Medical Officer of Health was the only agency who made comment.
- [11] In the his report the Medical Officer of Health stated "*In the amended plan, any shoppers using the lanes 1,2,3 & 4 (attached plan) are exposed to alcohol (red line) when they are walking towards the checkout end of the shop. This especially applies to the island which is a new addition to the amended plan. There are no heights shown for the new island or the other island (shown under the letter "A") so it is difficult to judge the level of exposure behind the islands. Shoppers wishing to access products in the aisles marked 1, 2, 3 & 4 should be able to do so and have a direct route to the checkouts without undue exposure to displays and promotions of alcohol and advertisements for alcohol. There is no mention or undertaking as to how alcohol will be promoted within the area and as to whether any promotion will be visible outside the single alcohol area. I suggest that it would be more appropriate, as demonstrated in other recently constructed supermarkets in Christchurch, to partition the alcohol area off in such a way to allow free access to shoppers wishing to purchase alcohol yet limiting the exposure of alcohol to other shoppers*".
- [12] I was of a mind to require a public hearing but as the main facts at issue are those which have been appealed to the Court of Appeal it would mean that the matter would be adjourned until the appeal has been disposed of. This could be some time away. The Authority has issued a section 172 direction recommending that all matters relating to the single area issue be adjourned if possible.
- [13] In making a decision I am cognisant that this is a variation to an existing licence, albeit a new building on the same site, but never the less the applicant is currently trading from the site. It seems to me to be unreasonable to adjourn the matter until such time as the appeal process has been completed. Simply refusing the application means the matter would no doubt be appealed and the matter heard by the Authority. Given the original Single Area Plan was not opposed by the agencies and the Medical officer of Health's comments relate to a decision which is now the subject of an appeal to the Court of Appeal the pragmatic approach would be to grant the application with the new single area plan as submitted.

[14] The base licence comes up for renewal in 17 months' time and the applicant will be well aware that the 'single area condition' will expire at the expiry of the licence. The condition can therefore be altered if need be at renewal of the licence. This may give the Medical Officer of Health some comfort in the light of his concerns expressed about the second single area plan submitted by the applicant.

[15] Section 201(4) also gives the committee the power to rehear any matter it has determined. Depending on the outcome of the appeal process this power may be exercised. That is a matter for the future.

[16] When a committee has an application such as this before it there are certain mandatory conditions which must be applied to the licence. Section 112 of the Act applies. This states that;

(1) The purpose of this section and sections 113 and 114 is to limit (so far as is reasonably practicable) the exposure of shoppers in supermarkets and grocery stores to displays and promotions of alcohol, and advertisements for alcohol.

(2) The licensing authority or licensing committee concerned must ensure that, when it issues or renews an off-licence for premises that are a supermarket or grocery store, it imposes on the licence a condition describing one area within the premises as a permitted area for the display and promotion of alcohol.

(3) On the renewal of an off-licence for premises that are a supermarket or grocery store, any single-area condition imposed when the licence was issued (or was last renewed) expires.

(4) Subsection (3) is subject to section 115(4).

[17] This in effect brings the application under sections 113 and 114 of the Act.

[18] These sections detail the compulsory conditions relating to display, promotion and advertising of alcohol in a single area in supermarkets and grocery stores.

[19] Any area designated as a single area must promote both the object of the Act and the purpose, or intention, of the condition as set out at section 112(1), "*to limit (so far as is reasonably practicable) the exposure of shoppers in supermarkets and grocery stores to displays and promotions of alcohol, and advertisements for alcohol*". The interpretation of this section is one of the points under appeal to the Court of Appeal.

[20] With the appeal process in motion regarding the application of the compulsory conditions and the fact that the single area plan is very similar to a number of other recently granted licences the reasonable and practical decision is to grant the variation to the base licence.

[21] I am satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in the Act and the variation is granted.

[22] **The new licence shall not issue until confirmation that a Certificate of Compliance has been issued and that all matters under the Building Act**

have been complied. The variation shall take effect from the date the new premise opens and the old ceases to trade. The plans submitted with the application (Plan 2) shall be the new plan showing the licensed area, including the 'Single Alcohol Area'.

The applicant must comply with all conditions specified on the licence.

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:-

Conditions

Compulsory conditions

The following conditions are compulsory:

(a) No alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1pm on Anzac Day.

(b) Alcohol may only be sold or delivered on the following days and during the following hours:

- Monday to Sunday 7.00 am to 9.00 pm

(c) Water must be freely available to customers, while alcohol is being supplied free as a sample on the premises.

(d) Single Area Condition: Alcohol Area for display and promotion of alcohol

- Only the area described and delineated on the plan approved by the District Licensing Committee is the permitted area for the display and promotion of alcohol within the premises as required under section 112.

Discretionary conditions

I recommend the following discretionary conditions:

(a) the following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons

(b) the following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the management of the premises concerned are observed:

- Alcohol must only be sold and supplied on the premises in accordance with the premises plan submitted with the application.

I recommend the following restrictions and requirements are noted on the licence:

Section 56 – Display of signs

Section 57 – Display of licences

Section 58 – Restrictions on kinds of alcohol sold in supermarkets and grocery shops, and premises directly accessible from supermarket or grocery shop

Section 59 - Requirements relating to remote sales by holders of off-licences

Section 214 – Manager to be on duty at all times and responsible for compliance

Section 215 – Circumstances where section 214 does not apply (for remote sales)
